### Minutes of Board Meeting

Thursday, September 2, 2021

The meeting of the Linden–Peters Rural County Fire Protection District Board of Directors was called to order by President John E. Plotz at 7:00 PM. Members present: Board Vice President Thomas G. Watkins, Board Member Paul Castellou, Jr., Board Secretary David Frison and Board Member Kenny Watkins III. Members Absent: None. L.P.F.D. on duty staff present: Fire Chief Kirk Noffsinger, Captain B. Ruegsegger, Lieutenant R. Ruegsegger, FFEN T. Watson and FFEN B. Wright.

**(I.)** Call to Order.

**(II.)** Roll Taken

Meeting minutes were taken by Fire Chief Kirk Noffsinger.

**(III.)** Public Comment – None

**(IV.)** Minutes:

A. Discussion & Possible Action re: Regular Board Meeting Minutes- August 5, 2021  
Board Minutes approved on motion by K. Watkins and seconded by D. Frison.  
Motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

**(VI.)** Financial Summary and Report

A. Monthly Financial, Current events summary for August 2021 - Presented by Fire Chief Kirk Noffsinger. Chief Noffsinger provided an update on the August 2021 Financial. Board Member K. Watkins asked for clarity on a couple of the expenses for the month of August. Chief Noffsinger provided the information concerning the bills.

**(VII.)** Consent Agenda:

A. Discussion & Possible Action re: Approval of the August 2021 Monthly Financial Report and expenditures. A motion to approve the financial report was made by P. Castellou Jr. seconded by D. Frison. Motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

**(VIII.)** Current Events Summaries, Reports, and/or Correspondence:

Current Events for the Linden-Peters Fire District was presented by Fire Chief Kirk Noffsinger.

A. Departmental Report-Fire Chief Kirk Noffsinger:

Chief Noffsinger provided an update on the events and meetings held for the month of August 2021. Chief Noffsinger noted that staff is currently on a Strike Team at the CALDOR FIRE. The crew has been out for about 7 days and the department is

planning on a crew rotation in the next 7 days. Chief Noffsinger provided the run report and an overview of some of the activities accomplished for the month by the crews.

The Chief advised the board that Engine 52 was taken to the shop due to an oil leak. It was found by the shop (Diesel Performance) that pressure was building in the engine crank case causing oil to blow out of the dip stick hole. The Chief informed the board that the mechanic stated that it was not a major issue at this time and engine could stay in service but repairs would be needed. The mechanics shop will be providing a quote for the needed repairs and the Chief would discuss the options with the board once the estimate is received. The Chief informed the board that due to the age of the engine and its mileage that it should be replaced. The board took no action on this.

The new Lucas Device (used to provide chest compressions during CPR) was placed in service and has been used already. This device was purchased with grant funding by the San Joaquin County EMS agency and each fire department in the county was provided one for their front-line apparatus.

There were three new BK portable radios (radios utilized for strike team deployment and used when communicating with state fire dispatch and agencies) purchased by the volunteer association have been programed and put into service.

Crews are finishing up on the downstairs bathroom maintenance. Once completed the bathroom can be used. This should be completed in the coming week.

**(IX.)** New Business

A. Discussion & Possible Action re: Discussion & Possible Action re: Approve Final FY 2021-FY 2022 Budget. (It should be noted that the original agenda item was incorrect noting the “Final **FY 2020-FY 2021** Budget”)

The board discussed any changes to the budget with Chief Noffsinger. Chief Noffsinger advised the board that there were a few updates to the budget that were needed and that the projected ending balance would not be impacted. A motion to accept the Final FY 2021 – 2022 Final Budget as presented was made by K. Watkins III and seconded by D. Frison. The motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

B. Discussion & Possible Action re: Crowley Emergency Services Consulting, LLC Contract for the Assistance to Firefighters 2021 Regional Radio Grant Application Writing Services in an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,000.00

The Chief discussed this contract with the board and advised the board that this cost would be shared with the other fire agencies participating in this regional radio grant. The board discussed what the grant was needed for. The Chief advised that the grant will be used to purchase quad band mobile and portable radios. Many of the departments current radios are single band radios which makes it difficult to communicate with other agencies during emergency responses both inside and outside of our district's boundaries.

A motion was made by D. Frison to sign the contract with Crowley Emergency Services Consulting, LLC and seconded by K. Watkins III. The motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

- C. Discussion & Possible Action re: Approval of Resolution 21-03 Agreement with California Department of Forestry Fire Assistance 50/50 Grant for the sum of \$9,358.25

The board discussed this request. The Chief informed the board that this was a grant that will be used to purchase six new portable BK radios to add to the departments older model radios. The resolution would be needed along with the funding to get the portable radios and other wildland safety equipment such as boots and gloves. The Chief stated that the funding for this was placed in the final budget.

A motion was made by K. Watkins III to approve the resolution 21-03 and provide the funding for the grant. Motion seconded by D. Frison. The motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

California Penal Code Sections 933 and 933.05 require that specific responses to all findings and recommendations contained in the above-mentioned report be submitted to the Presiding Judge of the San Joaquin County Superior Court within 90 days of receipt of the report.

Each independent special district shall respond to the findings and recommendations marked with a "Y" on the provided table in the report.

The following are the responses to those findings and recommendations made for the Linden-Peters Fire Protection District (LPPFD).

Findings:

F1.2 Not all elements of SB 929 compliance are present on the district website, negatively impacting public transparency.

The district agrees. The web-site is new and we are working with the vendor towards meeting SB 929 requirements.

F1.3 Imprecise links to the State Controller's Office website for financial transactions and board compensation make the website harder to use.

The district agrees. There is no link to the State Controller's Office to obtain the noted information. The LPPFD currently does not have the resources or expertise to ensure this is completed. We will be working with our vendor to have these and other links added to the web-site.

F1.4 The financial transactions on the State Controller's Office website do not provide an easy understood picture of the district's finances.

The district can not confirm this. The LPPFD has not searched the State Controller's Office for the district's financials. We will research this and if possible, update our web-site to include a link directly to the district's data.

F1.5 The San Joaquin Auditor-Controller's Office has audits and financial summaries for most districts that provide a more complete picture of the finances.

The district agrees. We believe that the Auditor-Controller does have that information but it is unknown to the district how to access it.

F1.6 The district could achieve higher levels of functionality and security on its website by leveraging the IS services of the county or other entity that has focused software for special districts.

The district agrees. The district was provided internet access and email accounts through the SJC Information Systems at no charge. Just recently we were removed from the SJC IS system for no apparent reason. We met with county representatives and asked for assistance in setting up and hosting a website and providing emails accounts for our employees. The county IS department was not interested in supporting the district in this endeavor. The district would be more than happy to work with the SJC ISD if the cost of their services were within reason.

Recommendations:

R1.3 By March 31, 2022, provide a link to the most recent audit on the district's website.

As stated above, the district will work diligently to get all needed links on its website to ensure the public has access to any and all required documentation.

R1.4 By November 30, 2021, confirm the accuracy of the information for the district in Appendix A – Independent Special Districts and provide corrections to the Grand Jury.

After a review of Appendix A it was found that there are no corrections or updates needed for the LPFD information.

FIREFIGHTER/ENGINEER****BUDGET: \$6,100 (PLUS TAX)****I. RECOMMENDATION:**

The Firefighters who ride in the back seat of Engine 5-3 recommend the installation of a Red Dot Roof Mount Air Conditioner to ensure the safety from the heat when the engine is deployed on strike teams out of county.

**II. BACKGROUND:**

Safety is the number one priority in the fire service. Engine 5-3 has a great A/C but unfortunately the firefighters in the back seat do not get any air flow. This poses a safety risk for the firefighters when in environments with extreme heat or when firefighters return from long hikes on the fire line. The Red Dot Roof Mount Air Conditioner system can be controlled independently by the firefighters in the back seat so there is no impeding on the crew in the front seat.

**III. DISCUSSION:**

With the purchase of this A/C, it will ensure firefighters in the back seat get adequate cool air flow to ensure quick recovery time after strenuous assignments.

**IV. ALTERNATIVES:**

The only alternatives I see would be utilizing the windows but when it is excessively hot outside, there is no recovery from the hot air flow.

**V. FISCAL IMPACT:**

The fiscal impact is \$6,100. This includes installation at the firehouse, parts, labor, Red Dot unit R6101, additional compressor and bracket, hoses, freon, hardware and a one-year manufacturer warranty. Install usually takes one business day for complete install. This does not include sales tax.

**ACTION ITEM:** Replace E5-2 (2003 Type I) with New Type I Engine**LEAD STAFF:** Kirk Noffsinger  
Fire Chief**BUDGET:** \$700,000.00 (est.)**DISCUSSION:**

The department currently provides emergency services to the public utilizing two (2) front line Type I fire engines, two (2) Type III fire engines and one (1) water tender (see attached equipment list). We recently received a Type VI OES Brush Truck used for responses when requested by the State of California.

Engine 5-2 is a Type I fire engine that was put in service in 2003 making the vehicle eighteen (18) years old. The engine has 100,799 miles and is used as a front line engine that is used every day. It was recently found during an engine inspection that the diesel engine is in need of an overhaul due to "dirt ingestion." An estimate of work required and cost is attached. The maintenance shop (Diesel Performance, Inc.) stated that the repairs to the diesel engine were not needed immediately but would need to be done within a couple of years.

The department makes every effort to ensure the safety of its employees when purchasing equipment. To accomplish this, we try to follow the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards. NFPA 1901 Annex D. Recommends replacement of fire engines after 15 years of use.

*To maximize firefighter capabilities and minimize risk of injury. It is important that fire apparatus be equipped with the latest safety features and operating capabilities. Fire departments should seriously consider the value (or risk) to firefighters of fire apparatus more than 15 years old in first line service. Apparatus that were not manufactured to applicable NFPA fire apparatus standards or that are over 15 Years old should be replaced.*

**ACTION:**

Staff recommends that the Board approve the purchase of a new Type I fire engine that meets or exceeds NFPA 1901 standards. If approved, the current Type I E5-2 would remain in service as a front line engine until a new Type I can be put in service. Once the new Type I is put in service, E5-2 can be repaired and placed back in service as a reserve engine.

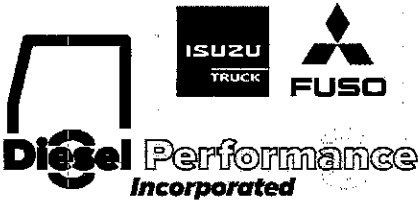

**ACTION ITEM: TRAINING IMPROVEMENTS – ASPHALT PROJECT****LEAD STAFF: JACOB REED  
CAPTAIN/TRAINING OFFICER****BUDGET: \$17,500.00****I. RECOMMENDATION:**

The Training Officer recommends the installation of black top behind the classroom to place our training props on a clean and hard surface including our roof prop, forcible door, and our future multi-story stacked shipping containers to resemble a one or two-story structure.

**II. BACKGROUND:**

Training is the backbone of the fire service. There is no way for firefighters to be proficient in their job if they can't practice. Having this training ground in our own back yard would make training on structure fires, hose management, forcible entry, search/rescue, high angle rope rescue, ladders, and ventilation effortless for the personnel all while not leaving the core of our district or district at all.

**III. DISCUSSION:**

Without the purchase of the blacktop, personnel would be dragging hose, rope, and other firefighting equipment through the gravel, mud, and glass shards causing wear and tear on the equipment thus causing us to spend more money on replacing equipment. If we are able to install the blacktop, we would be able to add shipping containers stacked with bedrooms inside resembling single or multi story residences. We would also install the forcible door and roof prop onto the shipping containers making it more realistic while using tools and ladders. Lastly, with the shipping containers resembling a 2<sup>nd</sup> story roof personnel could train on more high angle rope rescue type emergencies.

**IV. ALTERNATIVES:**

We could install the shipping containers on the gravel, causing wear and tear on our equipment or have to leave our district to get the same type of training. We would most likely have to use Stockton Fire Department Station #2 in downtown Stockton.

**V. FISCAL IMPACT:**

The fiscal impact is \$17,500 - 50 ft. x 60 ft = 3,000 sq. ft 2.5" thick of 1/2" AC. With 12" thick by 12" wide curb on west side of asphalt 60'.

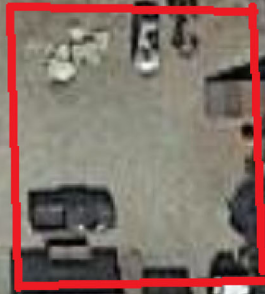
