MAST LEASE AGREEMENT

This Mast Lease Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this 1st day of January, 2024, between Ayera Technologies, Inc. (Lessee) and Linden-Peters Fire District (Lessor), owners of the property designated in Leased Space. This Agreement will supersede any previous agreement in effect as of the Commencement Date.

1. Term

The term of this Agreement shall be for five (5) years commencing on February 1, 2024 ("Commencement Date") and terminating on January 31, 2029 (the "Term") unless otherwise terminated as provided in Paragraph 7. Lessee shall have the right to extend the Term for up to three (3) successive five (5) year periods (the "Renewal Terms") on the same terms and conditions as set forth herein. This Agreement shall automatically be extended for each successive Renewal Term unless Lessee or Lessor notifies the other party their intent to not renew at least 180 days prior to commencement of the succeeding Renewal Term.

2. Rent and Services provided to Lessor

- a) Lessee shall pay to Lessor as rent One-Hundred-Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$150.00) per month ("Rent"). Rent shall be payable to Lessor at 17725 State Route 26, Linden, CA, 95236. Rent shall increase upon commencement of each renewal term by 10%.
- b) Lessee will, during the term of this Agreement and any option period, include a symmetrical network connection, burstable up to 1-Gbps, for Lessor's internal use to Lessor's 17725 State Route 26, Linden, CA station ("Fire Station"). This connections may be used for internet service ("Internet Service"), T1 Services, and/or Layer 2 connectivity between future Lessor locations. A routable public IP subnet up to a /28 (13 assignable IPs) shall be included upon request.
- c) Lessee shall provide, install, and maintain at no charge to Lessor, up to eight fixed cameras and one (1) Network Video Recorder ("NVR") at Fire Station.
- d) Lessee shall provide, install, and maintain at no charge to Lessor, up to three (3) emulated T1 service connections ("T1 Service") for Lessor's legacy TDM-type equipment located at Fire Station. Endpoint of each T1 Service circuit may vary, but must be at a location serviced by Lessee.

3. Leased Space

Approximately 25 vertical feet of space on upper portions of Lessor's existing rooftop 60 foot tall mast ("Mast") for Lessee's various antennas, mounts, and supporting equipment. Maximum Effective Projected Area (EPA) of Lessee's antennas shall not exceed sixteen (16) sqft. Approximate latitude / longitude of Mast is 38.016737, -121.099058. Leased Space also includes some indoor rack or wall space ("Shelter Space") for Lessee's power and switching equipment, and up to 5 Amps of 120V power paid for by Lessor via a nearby electrical outlet or panel. Any power used over the included amount will be paid monthly by Lessee

at actual cost of power. Leased Space also includes sufficient space and path for fiber, Ethernet, and/or Low Voltage power cabling from Mast to Shelter Space.

4. <u>Installation, Maintenance and Operation of Equipment</u>

- a) Lessee shall be responsible for the cost of all installation expenses. Lessee understands that cable runs may require roof, wall or parapet penetrations and that Lessee shall properly seal such penetrations.
- b) Lessee, at their sole discretion and cost, may add additional guy wires, guy anchor points, and/or cross-guy bracing on Mast to provide additional stabilization and anti-twist measures for the Mast.
- c) Lessee, at their sole discretion and cost, may order and have one or more fiber circuits installed into the Leased Space at or near the Shelter Space. Lessor understands that there may be wall or ground penetrations needed for such fiber circuits.
- d) Lessor will prevent future additional tenants on the Mast from installing and operating in such a manner that would cause interference to Lessee's operations. With the exception of Lessor's own equipment, Lessee shall be granted exclusive use of the following frequency ranges on the Mast: unlicensed 5180 to 6855 MHz, unlicensed 24100 to 24300, unlicensed 59400 to 69120 MHz, as well as any FCC Licensed frequencies registered to and in use by Lessee at the Mast location.
- e) Lessee's employees or designated contractors that climb the Mast at the Leased Space must have Competent or Authorized Climber certification issued from a reputable Tower Safety & Rescue Training Program such as Comtrain. All appropriate safety measures must be taken when climbing masts.
- f) Lessee will, during the term of this Agreement and any option period, have the right to ingress and egress with sufficient notice to Lessor. Such right shall be limited to authorized engineers of Lessee or persons under Lessee's direct supervision. Such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

5. Taxes

If personal property taxes are assessed, Lessee shall pay any portion of such taxes directly attributable to the Lessee Facilities. Except as provided immediately below, Lessor shall pay all real property taxes attributable to the land. Lessee shall reimburse Lessor for any increases in real property taxes which are assessed as a direct result of Lessee's improvements to the Land. As a condition of Lessee's obligation to pay such tax increases, Lessor shall provide to Lessee the documentation from the taxing authority, reasonably acceptable to lessee, indicating the increase is due to Lessee's improvements.

6. Termination

This Agreement shall be in effect for the dates and time periods stated herein. Upon expiration or earlier termination of the Lease, Lessee will remove all equipment installed on the Leased Premises within 60 days without damage to Lessor's property. Any equipment or property remaining following the 60 day removal period shall be deemed abandon by the Lessee and Lessor shall have the right to dispose of such property as it deems appropriate. Lessee shall repair any damage caused by its installation, maintenance or removal of its equipment and other personal property to the original building condition. During the term of the Agreement, Lessor will not grant a license to any other party which would interfere with Lessee's use of the premises as contemplated herein.

This Agreement may be terminated without further liability as follows:

- a) By either party upon a default of any covenant or term hereof by the other party, which default is not cured within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice of default, provided that the grace period for any monetary default is ten (10) days from receipt of notice.
- b) By Lessor if Lessee damages Lessor's property in any such way and does not repair within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice.

7. Indemnification

Lessee does hereby indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from any claim which may arise against Lessor by reason of any occurrence attributable to the installation, operation or maintenance of Lessee's equipment. Except if caused by the gross negligence or misconduct of Lessor or its employees, agents or representatives, Lessor shall not have any obligations or liability with respect to the Lessee's equipment or any obligation to comply with any current or future enacted laws or regulations relating thereto. Lessee's installation, maintenance and use of its equipment shall be at its own risk and expense.

8. Insurance

Lessee, at Lessee's sole cost and expense, shall procure and maintain on the Premises and on the Lessee Facilities, bodily injury and property damage insurance with a combined single limit of at least One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence. Such insurance shall insure, on an occurrence basis, against all liability of Lessee, its employees and agents arising out of or in connection with Lessee's use of Premises, all as provided for herein. Lessor shall be named as an additional insured on Lessee's policy. Lessee shall provide to Lessor a certificate of insurance evidencing the coverage required by this paragraph within ten (10) days of written request by Lessor.

9. Assignment and Subletting

Lessee may not assign or otherwise transfer all or any part of its interest in this Agreement or in the Premises without the prior written consent of Lessor; provided, however, that Lessee may assign its interest to its parent company, any subsidiary or affiliate or to any successor-in-interest or entity acquiring fifty-one percent (51%) or more of its stock or assets. Lessor may assign and/or transfer its title in interest in this Agreement upon written notice to Lessee, subject to the assignee and/or the transferee assuming all of Lessor's obligations herein.

10. Miscellaneous

- a) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all offers, negotiations and other agreements concerning the subject matter contained herein. Any amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and executed by both parties.
- b) If any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable with respect to any party, the remainder of this Agreement or the application of such provision to persons other than those as to whom it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected and each provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- c) This Agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the successors, transferees of title, and permitted assignees of the respective parties.
- d) This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.

Agreement for the Volunteer Fire Capacity Program of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978

RECITALS:

- 1. STATE has been approved as a passthrough agent of the United States Department of Agriculture, (USDA), Forest Service for the purpose of administering the Volunteer Fire Capacity program in California, hereinafter referred to as VFC, authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act (CFAA) of 1978 (PL 95-313, 92 Stat 365, 16 U.S.C. 2106), as amended.
- 2. This is a subaward under the 2023 Volunteer Fire Capacity Grant #23-DG-11052012-166 awarded to STATE by the Forest Service on August 3, 2023. The Federal Assistance Listing for the award is 10.698, Cooperative Forestry Program. This subaward is funded solely with Federal funds and is subject to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance in subparts A through F of 2 CFR Part 200, as adopted and supplemented by the USDA in 2 CFR Part 400, and under certain terms and conditions to LOCAL AGENCY to assist LOCAL AGENCY to upgrade its fire protection capability.
- 3. LOCAL AGENCY desires to participate in said VFC and agrees to the terms and conditions specified in the Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Capacity Program 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

- 4. <u>APPROVAL</u>: This Agreement is of no force or effect until signed by both parties and approved by the Department of General Services, if required. LOCAL AGENCY may not commence performance until such approval has been obtained.
- 5. <u>INCORPORATION</u>: The Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Capacity Program 2023, submitted Application for Funding and associated Grant Assurances are hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Grant Agreement.
- 6. TIMELINESS: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 7. <u>FORFEITURE OF AWARD</u>: LOCAL AGENCY must return this Agreement and required resolution properly signed and executed to STATE at the email address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than December 1, 2023 or LOCAL AGENCY will forfeit the funds.

8. GRANT AND BUDGET CONTIGENCY CLAUSE: It is mutually understood between the parties that this **Agreement** may have been written for the mutual benefit of both parties before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, to avoid program and fiscal delays that would occur if the **Agreement** were executed after that determination was made.

This Agreement is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the STATE by the United States Government for the State Fiscal Year 2023 for the purpose of this program. In addition, this Agreement is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, or conditions enacted by the Congress or to any statute enacted by the Congress that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this Agreement in any manner.

The parties mutually agree that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this **Agreement** shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The STATE has the option to invalidate the **Agreement** under the 30-day cancellation clause or to amend the **Agreement** to reflect any reduction in funds.

- 9. REIMBURSEMENT: STATE will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY, from funds made available to STATE by the Federal Government, an amount not to exceed \$1,810.00 on a 50/50 matching funds basis, for the performance of specific projects and/or purchase of specific items identified in Proposed Project, Application for Funding, attached hereto. Reimbursement will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and JUNE 30, 2024. This sum is the sole and maximum payment that STATE will make pursuant to this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY must bill STATE at the e-mail address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than September 1, 2024 in order to receive the funds. The bill submitted by LOCAL AGENCY must clearly delineate the projects performed and/or items purchased. A vendor's invoice and proof of payment to vendor(s) must be included for items purchased.
- 10. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>: Expenditure of the funds distributed by STATE herein is subject to the same limitations as placed by the VFC, upon expenditure of United States Government Funds. Pursuant to 2CFR200.313 Equipment, subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in that section; title to any equipment and supplies acquired under this **Agreement** vests with the LOCAL AGENCY. For any equipment items over \$5,000, the federal government may retain a vested interested in accordance with paragraph 17 below.
- 11. MATCHING FUNDS: Any and all funds paid to LOCAL AGENCY under the terms of this Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "VFC Funds", shall be matched by LOCAL AGENCY on a dollar-for-dollar basis, for each project listed on attachment(s) hereto identified as "Proposed Project". No amount of unpaid "contributed" or "volunteer" labor or services shall be used or consigned in calculating the matching amount "actually spent" by LOCAL AGENCY.

LOCAL AGENCY shall not use VFC Funds as matching funds for other federal grants, including Department of Interior (USDI) Rural Fire Assistance grants, nor use funds from other federal grants, including USDI Rural Fire Assistance grants, as matching funds for VFC Funds.

- 13. <u>PURPOSE</u>: Any project to be funded hereunder must be intended to specifically assist LOCAL AGENCY to organize, train, and/or equip local firefighting forces in the aforementioned rural area and community to prevent or suppress fires which threaten life, resources, and/or improvements within the area of operation of LOCAL AGENCY. Project funds are not to be used for research and development.
- 14. <u>COMBINING</u>: In the event funds are paid for two or more separate, but closely related projects, the 50/50 cost-sharing formula will be applied to the total cost of such combined projects.
- 15. OVERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project exceeds the estimate of costs upon which this Agreement is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request additional funds to cover the **Agreement** share of the amount exceeded. However, there is no assurance that any such funds are, or may be, available for reimbursement. Any increase in funding will require an amendment.
- 16. <u>UNDERRUNS</u>: In the event that the total cost of a funded project is less than the estimate of costs upon which this **Agreement** is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request that additional eligible projects/items be approved by STATE for **Agreement** funding. However, there is no assurance that any such approval will be funded. Approval of additional projects/items, not listed on the Proposed Project application, made by STATE, will be in writing and will require an amendment.
- 17. FEDERAL INTEREST IN EQUIPMENT: The Federal Government has a vested interest in any item purchased with VFC funding in excess of \$5,000 regardless of the length of this Agreement, until such time as the fair market value is less than \$5,000. The VFC percentage used to purchase the equipment will be applied to the sale price and recovered for the Government during the sale. This percentage will remain the same even following depreciation. The Federal Government may not have to be reimbursed if the disposal sale amounts to a fair market value of less than \$5,000. LOCAL AGENCY will notify STATE of the disposal of such items.

18. <u>EQUIPMENT INVENTORY</u>: Any single item purchased in excess of \$5,000 will be assigned an VFC Property Number by the STATE. LOCAL AGENCY shall forward a copy of the purchase documents listing the item, brand, model, serial number, any LOCAL AGENCY property number assigned, and a LOCAL AGENCY contact and return address to STATE at the address specified in paragraph 12. The STATE will advise the LOCAL AGENCY Contact of the VFC Property Number assigned.

- 19. AUDIT: LOCAL AGENCY agrees that the STATE, the Department of General Services, the Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of five (5) years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, LOCAL AGENCY agrees to include a similar right of the State of California to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this Agreement. (GC 8546.7, PCC 10115 et seq., CCR Title 2, Section 1896).
- 20. <u>DISPUTES</u>: In the event of any dispute over qualifying matching expenditures of LOCAL AGENCY or audit findings, the dispute will be decided by STATE and its decision shall be final and binding.
- 21. MONITORING: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to the monitoring of activities as necessary by STATE to ensure that the award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the agreement; and that performance goals are achieved.
- 22. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless, the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims and losses, accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this **Agreement**, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by LOCAL AGENCY in the performance of this **Agreement**.
- 23. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to comply with civil rights requirements as detailed in the Complying With Civil Rights Requirements brochure (FS-850) and the And Justice For All poster (AD-475A). The poster is to be placed at all public point of contact/reception areas.
- 24. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:
 - a. Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
 - b. Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:

- 1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
- 2) the person's or organization's policy of maintaining a drugfree workplace;
- any available counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and,
- 4) penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
- c. Every employee who works on the proposed Agreement will:
 - 1) receive a copy of the company's drug-free workplace policy statement; and,

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in suspension of payments under the **Agreement** or termination of the **Agreement** or both and LOCAL AGENCY may be ineligible for funding of any future State **Agreement** if the department determines that any of the following has occurred: (1) the LOCAL AGENCY has made false certification, or violated the certification by failing to carry out the requirements as noted above. (GC 8350 et seq.)

- 25. <u>TERM</u>: The term of the Agreement SHALL COMMENCE ON THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and continue through June 30, 2024.
- 26. <u>TERMINATION</u>: This **Agreement** may be terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice to the other party or provisions herein amended upon mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- 27. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: No amendment or variation of the terms of this **Agreement** shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or **Agreement** not incorporated in the **Agreement** is binding on any of the parties.
- 28. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>: LOCAL AGENCY, and the agents and employees of LOCAL AGENCY, in the performance of this **Agreement**, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the STATE or the Federal Government.
- 29. <u>INDIRECT RATE</u>: LOCAL AGENCY may not assess an indirect rate in excess of their Federally approved Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA), a de minimis rate if LOCAL AGENCY does not have an approved NICRA, or the VFC program cap rate of 10%, whichever is lesser. LOCAL AGENCY may also elect not to assess an indirect rate. The approved indirect cost rate at the time of execution is 0%.
